Update from Akiba School

A Center of Growth

Over the past year Akiba School beat the national average and led their area in academic performance. Students excelled in English and Swahili and Class 8 graduates went on to leading high schools.

With the restructuring of the Kenyan educational system under the new government, Akiba now offers Elementary, Primary, and Junior Secondary schools serving over 350 students. While families in the area work hard, many struggle to provide for their children.

Your support has enabled needy students to attend school while supporting general development and teaching staff at Akiba. The Akiba Board of Directors and management have made strong strides



in maintaining quality teaching staff while working to build a sustainable model for Christian education in very low income communities. Your partnership is key to the school's continued growth and success.

This year Akiba students received awards for their performances at the Nairobi Music Festival and engaged in a variety of extracuricular activities, sports programs, and field trips.

High School Scholarships *Building a Brighter Future*

During 2023, Kenya Connection provided full scholarships to 58 high school students in 35 selected boarding schools across Kenya.

Our team of amazing youth mentors met regularly with the scholarship students as well as their parents or guardians. They coordinated their transportation adn school fee and offered prayer support as well as counseling and tutoring services. Many of the youth mentors sat in the same desks as our current scholarship students in elementary school. Now they serve as powerful role models and witnesses to the impact of education and faith.

The Chichi Amina Scholarship program provides college and university scholarships based on academic merit and financial need. Over the past year, scholarships have been provided to 16 students studying courses such as Agricultural Economics, Business Administration, Catering, Criminal Justice, Journalism, Computer Science, Finance, Medical Engineering, Nursing, and more. All of the college scholarship students are graduates of New Beginnings and many were sponsored from a young age at Akiba School.

New Beginnings

Helping High School Graduates Build a Foundation for Adulthood

New Beginnings is a six-month discipleship program for recent high school graduates. Participants grow together through structured study, service, and mission. They engage in weekly Bible studies and discussions, take computer classes and learn about topics like financial literacy, Christian communication, career development, and more. The goal is to equip young adults with tools and skills for healthy living and to help them discover and use their unique gifts and talents to make an impact for God's glory. The majority of participants completed their high school education as a result of scholarships through Kenya Connection.

This year members participated in a special camp at Lake Elementeita, where they enjoyed games, hiking, swimming, bonfires, and special guest speakers who explored the themes of fatherlessness, our Heavenly Father, and redemption. Following a special footwashing ceremony, participants were awarded certificates for successfully completing the course. Many of them have now joined a network of alumni mentors and volunteers who help to support student sponsorship programs.













Inspiring Hope

And Building Sustainable Businesses and Ministries

One of the biggest challenges facing high school and college graduates in Kenya is "what next?" With limited opportunities for formal jobs and youth unemployment levels reaching 35%, crime, sexual promiscuity, and addiction, are easy lures, especially in the congested environment of urban slums.

Kenya Connection is proud to work with graduates of Akiba School and the New Beginnings discipleship program to provide internships and apprenticeships and to create opportunities for sustainable income and productive service.

We've been blessed with a strong and creative team of young professionals with skills in photography and video production, graphic design, and website development. Over the past two years, we've built a website team which has created websites for three Christian ministries, and helped an established parachurch organization increase its exposure over 600%. Meanwhile, the video and photography team provided services to the Kenyan parliament, and helped to film documentaries and teaching videos in East and Southern Africa. Recently, the team moved into a new office next to Nairobi University.

Building Just Communities


Our Journey in Chakama began in 2019, we thank God for the growth we have seen. We currently have 80 students at the Kilifi mission center School. These are Elementary age school children; their parents can barely afford to feed them. At the center we are able to provide a Christian based education and give them meals at least twice a day whenever funds are available. We are also blessed to have 10 high school students and the first ever University Student in Chakama village, Rajab Katana.

The Giriama people are the inhabitants of Kilifi and about 95% are traditionally Muslim. Giriama is one of the Mijikenda dialects spoken in the Kenyan coast by about half a million people.

Most of our students in Kilifi are Muslim, it was great to experience the spirit of unity despite the different religious backgrounds. Parents were asked to express at least one thing that they appreciated about their child, this is not an easy thing especially in a culture where feelings of love and gratitude are demonstrated rather than said. Thankfully, many parents rose up to the occasion and affirmed their children.

We are grateful for the partnership we have with Reverend Moses and Mrs. Jane Oduor for their leadership and mentorship. They have dedicated themselves to live in a very hard area, we are more than grateful for their service.
